Afghanistan Turmoils Moves Soroptimist Mission Into Focus

American eyes have for the past several months been focused on the country of Afghanistan. With 13 U.S. servicemen killed in the closing days of U.S. involvement, so many questions still remain concerning Afghanistan's future after August 31st.

It was nearly two decades ago that America rescued the future of thousands of Afghan women and children with it's defeat of the Taliban, and many fear that these efforts will be abandoned to the Taliban during this post August, 2021 period.

The Taliban, always known for brutal treatment of Afghan women and girls, had prohibited girls from being educated, imprisoned women in their homes and often subjected them to violence, humiliation, torture, and gruesome executions.

Laura Bush gave a Presidential Radio Address in November 2001 to raise awareness of the plight of Afghan women and girls. President Bush and Afghan President Hamid Karzai formed the U.S, Afghan Women's Council, which launched dozens of programs to help women and girls in Afghanistan rebuild their lives. Of course, these hardwon gains are in grave jeopardy because of the most recent slapdash U.S. withdrawal from Afghanistan.

Especially as Soroptimists, whose mission is to better the lives of women and girls, our attention needs to be on the lives and future of these Afghan women and girls, who made enormous progress over the past 20 years. Girls have been educated; women run businesses and serve as soldiers, police officers and provincial mayors. These women have been trained as physicians allowing access to health care for the first time. They are some of the most courageous, shrewd, resilient and inspiring women whom we cannot watch be abandoned to the very likely horrific fate that awaits them under Taliban rule again.
